When Lawyers Need a Translator

- 1. Communications with Clients

Qualities that I look for in a translator:

- 1. Ability to translate in plain language
- 2. Ability to spot legal jargon and to seek clarifications
- 3. Ability to maintain a neutral tone

Cohabitation Agreements/Marriage Contracts Purpose and Timing

- 1. Before marriage: Cohabitation Agreements
- 2. Common Law Spouse: no less than three years in a conjugal relationship, or have a biological child
- 3. After Marriage: Marriage Contracts
- 4. Common Law Spouse v. Married Spouse: Different entitlements/rights

Purpose of Cohabitation Agreement/Marriage Contract

- To avoid or reduce litigation upon a separation
- To protect assets/properties gifted or loaned from other family members
- To set out some rules re living situations

Cohabitation Agreements/Marriage Contracts Recommendations

- Separate Lawyers: ILA (independent legal advice) and ILR (independent legal representation)
- 2. May consider collaborative family law lawyers: Pros and Cons
- 3. Full and Honest financial disclosure (within Ontario and oversea)
- 4. Not too close to the wedding: claims re duress/undue influence
